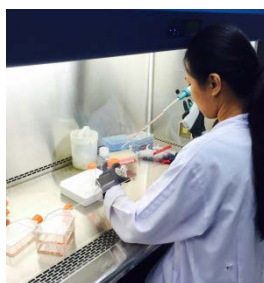

## WHO CAN APPLY

- US CITIZENS AND PERMANENT RESIDENTS
- UNDERGRADUATE AND GRADUATE STUDENTS
- MUST BE EITHER: 1) FROM AN UNDER-REPRESENTED MINORITY GROUP, 2) FROM SOCIOECONOMICALLY DISADVANTAGED BACKGROUND OR 3) FROM RURAL AREAS.
- STUDENTS FROM ALL ACADEMIC DISCIPLINES ARE ENCOURAGED TO APPLY.
